

AED

*Mothers hold their children's hands for a while,
their hearts forever.
Bethany would like to help keep those hearts safe.*

In April, the Administrative Council voted to purchase an Automatic External Defibrillator (AED). This is a device used in case of a cardiac emergency, prior to the arrival of emergency responders. The AED can be used by anyone in the church, since it has a talking feature that walks one through the steps of the application. Everyone is welcome and encouraged to take the CPR/AED class that will be offered, so anyone can feel confident to offer aid. Check with the newsletter, bulletin, **connection card** and the church web site for dates and times.

The monies used came from the Blessings Account. Over the past few years, whenever someone felt thankful or blessed by someone, they could donate money in the form of a Blessing to the church. No money for this purchase came from the operating budget.

We feel this AED can be a blessing to our church. We care about everyone in God's family. Our prayer is that we will never have to use this device, but in an emergency situation every second counts, this could save you or your loved one's life.

As always the first thing to do in an emergency is to call **911**.

Automated Giving ... How it helps your church.....How it helps You

It has been a few months since Bethany's Automatic Giving Program was started. During that time many members have enrolled in the program and have started enjoying the new program. Your Finance Team thought perhaps it would be a good time to review with all of Bethany's supporters the reasons why the Automatic Giving Programs is such a good idea.

Why Direct Giving Is Good For Bethany?

- Provides Bethany a more consistent flow of income that is not interrupted by vacations, illnesses, and can we say other events such as the Great Blizzard of 2018? If you are unable to attend church on a particular Sunday, your gift can still be there.
- Reduces the time and expense the church incurs when processing deposits.

Why is Direct Giving Good For You, the Giver?

- Eliminates the need to write out checks and fill out Giving Envelopes weekly. Allows you to have your bank account debited directly in the same way you may already be doing with some of your other recurring expenses.
- Satisfaction of knowing that even if you are unable to attend church on a Sunday, your gift will be there to continue your support of Bethany's programs.

How to enroll in Bethany's Automated Giving Program:

You may enroll in the Automatic Giving program in two ways:

1. Fill out the portion of the Weekly Envelope indicated for Automatic Giving. Once you have filled out this section, mail the envelope to the office or drop it off after church services. The church staff will then enter your information into the secure banking software.

You will receive an acknowledgment from the banking software, **VANCO**, (either via email or regular mail depending on your designation) of your intent to initiate automatic giving using the bank account you listed.

2. Go to Bethany's website and click on the **Automatic Giving button** and follow the simple instructions.

Will my bank information be secure?

Whether you choose to have the Bethany Office enter your information or you choose to enter the information directly on the church's website, your information will be safe and secure.

What if I wish to change my Gift amount, frequency or stop completely?

Changing or stopping your automatic gift is easy and fast and can be done by notifying the Bethany Office or you may make the change directly on the church's website. Your changes can be made at any time.
